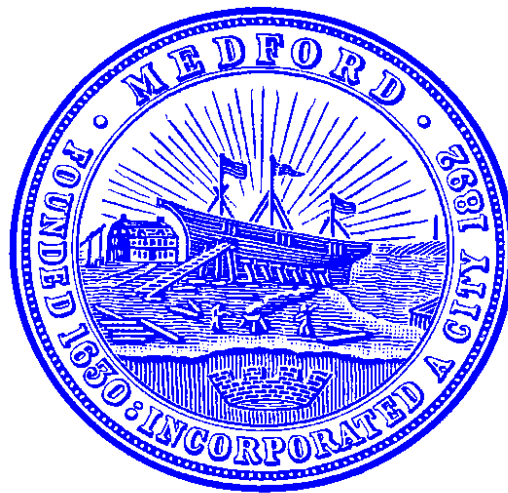


A Message from the MAYOR...

Trash is collected weekly and must be out on the curb by 7:00 a.m. on your trash collection day. Trash collection will be delayed one day during a holiday week. Household trash includes food waste, clothing, soiled items, and unwanted items. Appliances need a sticker to be picked up. You may purchase a sticker at the Public Works office. No building materials, hazardous materials, tires, or propane tanks will be collected.

Please Recycle!

If you need a recycling bin, you can pick one up at City Hall, Room 304. Recycling brochures are also available and list all recyclables collected. Recycling is collected every other week and determined by either a green or blue bin.

You can recycle glass, tin, aluminum, plastic (#'s 1-5 and #7), newspapers, magazines, junk mail, paper, and cardboard. Other disposables (such as batteries, light bulbs, paint, etc.) can be dropped off at City Hall or the City Yard on James St.
